

Obsession Off-Line Quick Guide

Version 5.1.0

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Introduction

Obsession Off-Line is a DOS program that runs on an IBM $^{\otimes}$ -compatible personal computer and emulates system software for all Obsession $^{\otimes}$ II models. This Quick Guide explains how to install and use Off-Line for Obsession systems running version 5.1.0 or later software.

Obsession Off-Line provides the same commands, displays, prompts and help information available on the Obsession II system. For example, in Obsession Off-Line you can patch a show, create groups, write cues, create labels and print just as you can when working online.

Shows produced in Obsession Off-Line may be stored on the computer's hard drive or on a floppy diskette for transfer to the Obsession II system.

Obtaining Off-Line

You can obtain Obsession Off-Line either on diskette from ETC® or as a download from ETC's website. Several versions are available to match the software version of your Obsession system. Also available at the website is a keyboard command template and several versions of Obsession user manuals, all in portable document format (pdf). If you don't have Adobe® Acrobat® Reader™, click the link at the ETC website to transfer to a site where you can download the program.

Computer Requirements

- Pentium[®] processor recommended, 133MHz or greater
- DOS 6.2, Windows[®] 95, Windows 98
- · 20MB available hard drive space
- 64MB available RAM
- Color monitor

Incompatibilities

Obsession Off-Line is incompatible with the following:

- PC-DOS, Windows NT, Windows 2000 and Windows Me, Windows XP
- · SMARTDRV older than 5.0
- Virtual PC™, SoftWindows™ and any other DOS emulator for Macintosh® computers

A Note About Offline Editing with Obsession II

The Offline Editing option on the Hardware menu of an Obsession II system has nothing to do with this Obsession Off-Line application. That selection allows you to use actual Obsession II hardware to create or edit shows without outputting any data from the system. This application emulates the Obsession II on your PC and allows you to create or edit show data for use on an Obsession II system.

Installing Obsession Off-Line

Follow a procedure below to install Obsession Off-Line into your computer. Obsession Off-Line installs automatically into the **C:\Etc\Obsn510** folder. The installation also creates an icon in the ETC folder that you can reach from the Start menu to launch the program. If any or all of these folders don't already exist, they are created in the installation process.

From a Downloaded File

This procedure assumes that you downloaded Obsession Off-Line from the ETC website. During the download procedure you will be asked to specify where you want to store the file in your computer. Remember that storage location for step 1 below.

- Step 1: Navigate in Windows Explorer to the location of the downloaded file.
- Step 2: Double-click the filename (should be ObsOff510.exe).
- Step 3: Follow the on-screen instructions, clicking **Next** or **Finish** as needed.



Note: While installing, you will be asked to approve recommended folders. If you need to change these locations, please call ETC Technical Services for additional instructions.

From Diskettes

Use this procedure if you obtained Obsession Off-Line on diskettes.



Note: If you need to reinstall this program, first uninstall Obsession Off-Line 5.1.0 in the Windows Add/Remove Programs control panel. For instructions, see your Windows documentation.

- Step 1: Insert installation diskette 1 into the disk drive.
- Step 2: Double click My Computer.
- Step 3: Double click the icon for your diskette drive.
- Step 4: Double-click Setup.exe.
- Step 5: Follow the on-screen instructions, removing and inserting additional installation diskettes as directed and clicking **Next**, **OK** or **Finish**.



While installing, you will be asked to approve recommended folders. If you need to change these locations, please call ETC Technical Services for additional instructions.

Start Obsession Off-Line from the Windows Start menu:

Step 1: In the **Start** menu, click **Programs** then **ETC Software**.

Step 2: Open the Obsession Off-Line 5 folder and click on Obsession Off-Line 5.1.0.



Note:

A Windows shut down procedure begins, accompanied by warnings and normal exiting procedures by any Windows applications running at that time. After Windows shuts down, Off-Line starts.

Quit Obsession Off-Line

Press F10 F10 ESC to quit Obsession II Off-Line. Windows will restart.

Obsession Off-Line User Interface

To use your computer keyboard with Obsession Offline you need to set the Scroll Lock ON when entering Obsession commands or command arguments and OFF when entering labels or memo text. Since both the Obsession II and the alphanumeric keyboard contain numerical keys, set the Scroll Lock ON when entering numerical information such as channel or cue numbers.

A list of keyboard equivalents appears in the back of this Quick Guide and is also available online by pressing **SHIFT-F1**.

Some keyboard equivalents may only be reached after you first open a window by typing a function key. Those windows are discussed below.

Faders Window (F7)

Press **F7** to open the Faders Window. Use \rightarrow and \leftarrow to select a fader and \uparrow and \downarrow to adjust the slider's level. The **Page Up** and **Page Down** keys adjust levels in 10% increments.

Submasters Window (F8)

Press **F8** to open the Submasters Window. Use \rightarrow and \leftarrow to select a submaster slider and \uparrow and \downarrow to adjust the slider's level. The **Page Up** and **Page Down** keys adjust levels in 10% increments. Press **F9** to select [Blackout].

Wheels Window (F9)

Press **F9** to open the Wheels Window. Use \rightarrow and \leftarrow to select the level or rate wheel and \uparrow and \downarrow to adjust settings. The **Page Up** and **Page Down** keys adjust levels in 10% increments. Press **F9** to select [All Manual]. Press **F1** to select the playback [Rate] key.

Display Modes (F10)

Press **F10** to open the Display Modes Window. Then press one of the **F1–F8** function keys to select that display. Press **F9** to select Memo. Press **F10** to quit Off-Line. The **F1–F8** keys toggle between conventional and moving light (ML) displays. If you don't get the display you want after pressing a toggling key in the Display Modes Window, enter the window a second time and press the toggling key again.



<u>Note:</u>

The Live and Blind toggles are also available by pressing **F5** and **F6**, respectively, without entering the Display Modes Window. If you are already in a conventional display (Live, Blind or Group), you can switch to another conventional display just by pressing the display key once. Similarly, if you are already in an ML display (ML Live, ML Blind or ML Group), you need only press a display key once to go to another ML display. You can switch between modes and also to another display type by pressing the **F5** or **F6** key twice.

Create a Show

Off-Line always starts as if it were running an Obsession II - 4600 console. In that configuration, Obsession supports up to 4608 channels and 8192 dimmers. If you are creating a show for an Obsession II model that supports fewer channels or dimmers, you will need to reset the channel and/or dimmer count. Failure to reset these counts will allow you to create patches that may not operate properly in your Obsession II system. Your channel and dimmer count settings are saved with the show.

Use the information in the table below to set the maximum channel and dimmer counts for your purposes. To make these changes in Obsession Off-Line, press **F10 F8 1 ENTER** and select options 1 or 2 (Scroll Lock must be ON to insert Obsession commands).

Obsession II - 750	750	8192

Load a Saved Show

Your previously-saved show may be loaded into Obsession Off-Line either from your computer's hard drive or from a diskette.

Load a show from diskette:

Step 1: Insert the diskette into the disk drive.

Step 2: Press **F10**, then **F8** to view the Setup menu.

Step 3: Press **3 ENTER** to view the Diskette Functions menu.

Step 4: Press **4 ENTER ENTER** to load the show.

Load a show from the hard drive:

Step 1: Press F10, then F8 to view the Setup menu.

Step 2: Select **4 ENTER** to view the Hard Drive Functions display.

Step 3: Press CTRL-F6 ENTER ENTER to load the show.

Save a Show

You can save a show either to your computer's hard drive or to a diskette. Obsession Off-Line does not save shows automatically. To save show data, perform one of the two procedures below before exiting.

Save a show to diskette:

- Step 1: Insert the diskette into the disk drive.
- Step 2: Press **F10**, then **F8** to view the Setup menu.
- Step 3: Press **3 ENTER** to view the Diskette Functions menu.
- Step 4: Press **1 ENTER ENTER** to store the show.

Save a show to the hard drive:

- Step 1: Press **F10**, then **F8** to view the Setup menu.
- Step 2: Press **4 ENTER** to view the Hard Drive Functions display.
- Step 3: Press CTRL-F2 ENTER ENTER to store the show to the hard drive.

Print from Obsession Off-Line

Obsession Off-Line will print to whatever printer you have connected to the parallel port of your computer. If you do not have a printer connected to your computer, or if your computer uses a network printer rather than a local printer, an error message is displayed saying the printer can't be located.

If you do not have a local printer, or if your printer is off, Obsession Off-Line will create a file named **PRN01.**\$\$\$ in the Obsession Off-Line directory, **C:\Etc\OBSN10**. You can read and edit **PRN01.**\$\$\$ with any word processor or text editor.

Open the PRN01.\$\$\$ file:

- Step 1: Double-click the file. Windows will ask you what application you want to use to read it.
- Step 2: Select an application and click OK.



<u>Note:</u>

To dedicate the file to a certain word processor, change the file's extension from \$\$\$ to whatever your word processor uses, for example ".doc" for Microsoft Word, or ".txt" to use a text editor.



CAUTION:

Every print file created as explained above is named the same thing and stored in the same place. New print files overwrite existing ones using the same name. If you want to reserve a print file and ensure it won't be overwritten, change its file name or move it to another location.

Obsession Off-Line keyboard equivalents

For help with any Obsession II command, type [?] and then type the command's keyboard equivalent.
